We dared to believe that we could impact the globe with hope! Our organization to operates on three principles, we identify as pillars: Service, Outreach, and Empowerment.

In an attempt to encapsulate the task and events that have been executed and accomplished, it is most challenging to place words onto the page. We have witnessed numbers into the thousands being impacted beyond our imagination.

By active empowerment. We have extended our reach so that service could be duplicated. An example of At-risk community populations served are transient, mentally ill, juvenile, human traffic victims, cancer patients, and people that identify with drug addiction.

We average serving as an organization twice per month. And, we serve in larger groups 3-4 times per year, not to mention our rise during critical tragedy and the need for

emergency response.

In addition to service, we have surpassed our own expectation in the dynamic of outreach. We began building our digital network, HOH Network to comprise digital radio, and visual media to continue to reach those around the world. We are pleased to note that our neighboring continent, South America (Brazil) is 2nd in our analytics as they are watching the movement of Hope Over Hurt consistently!

Empowerment leads to transformative habit. We have hosted to major empowerment events this year that included reflective models, art therapy, song, dance, and sound research-based teaching that initiated several of our national service partners (individuals new to serving) to fly into town just to be part of our empowering events this past year.

We traveled to other cities in outreach mode, financially supported the mission of other change agents, rose to the call of need during Hurricane Dorian by donating hard items and currency, while developing Emergency Kits for children that were dispersed to children at various schools. Yet, this is only a portion of our impactful drive of HOH.

While there is much gratitude in this reflection, the work continues. As we set our vision for broader and deeper impact, we hold fast to the declaration, "We believe. Love is our arsenal."




STORIES OF HOPE






